ALNMOUTH REMEMBRANCES AND RECOLLECTIONS

All of you who worship at St John the Baptist or have visited will have walked through what we know as "the Brims Doors" as you come from the porch into the Nave, but have you ever noticed the inscription above them?

"In loving memory of Charles William Brims 1877-1944"





And at the altar rail, have you noticed the inscription there?

"ADMG and to the beloved memory of Wedgwood Vaughan late Lieutenant R.N.V.R who fell asleep on April 25th 1918"

Looking into what we see around us can bring connections together in the story of our village, lives lived here, worship and witness. Spurred on by chats with Pam Muggleton and Joan Davidson in 2021/22, stories and links began to emerge.

Joan typed out for me the whole property history of her home on Riverside: the purchase of the land in the 1890s from the Duke of Northumberland by the Vaughans from Gosforth to build a holiday home, known as The Cottage; then passed to their son-in-law Charles Brims in the 1920s; sold in the 1950s, renamed Blue Dolphins and by the 1980s in the ownership of Jack and Joan Davidson.

Robin Vaughan Brims, alive and well, has been a friend of ours over the years and indeed of many churches in Northumberland in the role he held as Chair for the Northumbria Historic Churches Trust. He often popped in to see the doors and last month other relatives met up in Alnmouth to catch up on family history too.

So more Alnmouth connections to industrial and maritime history of Newcastle and the North East and to World Wars that we remember this month.

It was Mary Amery Vaughan who bought that land, with her husband William Steains Vaughan acting as surety. He worked for Cammel Laird, was a keen sailor, fisherman and artist and involved in the running of our church and in the boat club in Alnmouth.

Their youngest daughter Vera married Charles William Brims. Charles lived initially in Newcastle and was the MD of Brims and Co started by his grandfather in about 1860, constructing dry docks and harbours based in Hebburn. In Alnmouth he was one of the Vicar's wardens for many years. Charles died on 28 Aug 1944 at The Cottage and is commemorated by the oak Brims Doors. At the time, his eldest son David was a Prisoner of War in Germany having been captured early in the war and held in captivity for many years – another Remembrance Day reflection. David was Robin Brims father.

Wedgwood, also a keen sportsman and yachtsman, was another child of William and Mary Vaughan. He showed early promise, working in shipping firms including the Blyth Shipbuilding Company, but he sustained serious head injuries in a motor-cycle accident just before the outbreak of the WW1. However, in 1914 he took a commission in the Royal Naval Reserve carrying mail in Scotland; then for 6 months was a Red Cross motor driver in France; and latterly worked at an aeroplane factory. Health-wise, there were repeated episodes of ill health and treatment, but he eventually died from pneumonia in 1918, just before the war ended. He must have been as sorely missed as those lost directly in conflict.

Incidentally, if you are ever in the USA, W S Vaughan's younger brother Henry was an architect and went to live there, where he designed the reredos at Washington cathedral.
