HARVEST AND THANKSGIVING SERVICE



There are Gift Aid Envelopes in Church for Self Help Africa and we would also ask you to bring Non Perishable pre packed produce which will be given to the Food Bank.





(20th) some of us
met up with a
small group of
Pilgrims who are



walking from the River Tees to Lindisfarne, celebrating the life and faith of St Cuthbert, telling the story at schools and churches on the way, and sharing their faith with many others they meet as they journey from place to place. Their carefully planned route included staying at Alnmouth overnight, and a lovingly

prepared meal was shared in the Chapel, together with Celtic prayers and good fellowship.

After the meal we all went up to the church where they showed us the facsimile of the Lindisfarne Gospels, so beautifully written and illustrated by the monks 1200 years ago, and we were able



to turn the pages – something you can't do in the British Museum! And we also saw the beautiful carving on the replica of Cuthbert's coffin, and learned how the monks escaped from the marauding Vikings, carrying the coffin which contained both Cuthbert's body and the precious Gospels – a miracle in itself! So, during the 12 days of the Pilgrimage they are telling the story of Cuthbert and the Gospels – the Good News which is the same today as in 715AD! And they are also raising funds for Feeding Families which works to tackle food poverty in the North East. Altogether a great time!
